





Incarcerated Parents and their Minor Children

Incarceration often creates challenges for children and families at **home**, in **school**, and in their **communities**.

Children may experience:

- Financial and material hardship
- Unpredictability in family relationships and structure
- Difficulty with school relationships and performance
- Struggles with mental and physical health
- Social and institutional stigma

Overview of the Minnesota Student Survey

Minnesota Student Survey (MSS)

- Background, School, Health, Out of School Activities, (At-risk) Behaviors
- 164,310 total students surveyed
- Administered every 3 years
- In 2013, Duluth, Minneapolis and Rochester school districts were among the districts that did not participate.
- New Question was added...

"Have any of your parents or guardians ever been in jail or prison? (*Mark ALL that apply*)"

- None of my parents or guardians has ever been in jail or prison.
- Yes, I have a parent or guardian in jail or prison right now.
- Yes, I have had a parent or guardian in jail or prison in the past.

Youth in the sample


- 114,828 students responded to the parental incarceration question
 - Public School = 112,787
 - Alternative Learning Centers = 1,720
 - Juvenile Correctional Facilities = 321
- Public Schools- 8th, 9th, and 11th grade




Gender of all youth in the sample




(Mean) Age of all youth in the sample




Race and ethnicity of youth in the sample

IEP or Special Education Services of all youth in sample




Demographics Characteristics of Students by School Setting

As we go from Public Schools to ALCs to JCFs...

Percentage of MN Youth Affected by Parental Incarceration




Currently has an incarcerated parent

WARNING - Young people of color are disproportionally represented in the criminal justice system. Research points to many causes, including inequitable distribution of resources, and bias within policies and practices, indicating that systemic issues play an important role in intergenerational cycles of incarceration.








School Setting: Unexcused Absences




School Setting: Discipline








School Setting: School Connectedness



REPORTED FREQUENT BINGE DRINKING^a




Tobacco Use

USED TOBACCO AT LEAST ONCE IN THE LAST 30 DAYS




REPORTED FREQUENT USE IN THE LAST 30 DAYS (20+ DAYS)

TRIED MARIJUANA (POT, WEED) OR HASHISH (HASH, HASH OIL)












Purposeful Self Injury






Suicidal Ideation






Suicide Attempt




Diagnosis of Long-term Mental, Emotional, or Behavioral Problem





Treatment for Mental Health Problems




Key Findings

- Higher rates of serious mental health concerns
 - Internalizing
 - Self injurious behaviors
 - Suicidal ideation and suicide attempt
 - Diagnosis of long term mental emotional or behavioral problem
 - Receipt of treatment for mental health problems
- Higher rates for females than males



Overweight and Obesity




No Physical Activity – Last 7 Days


No Vegetables – Last 7 Days


Three or More Sodas Per Day

Key Findings

- Higher rates of behaviors associated with chronic health conditions
 - Overweight and obesity
 - Lack of physical activity
 - Lack of vegetables
 - Consumption of sugary drinks
- Higher rates of asthma

Poverty

"Do you currently get free or reduced-price lunch at school?"

"During the last 30 days, have you had to skip meals because your family did not have enough money to buy food?"

"During the past 12 months, have you stayed in a shelter, somewhere not intended as a place to live, or someone else's home because you had no other place to stay?"

Race and ethnicity questions

- "Are you a member of any of the following ethnic or cultural groups: Hispanic or Latino, Somali, or Hmong?"
- "What is your race?"
 - Hispanic was treated like a race category all races are exclusive (not Hispanic)
 - American Indian and Native Alaskan
 - Asian and Pacific Islander
 - Black or African American
 - White

Unexcused Absences

"During the last 30 days, how many times have you skipped school or cut classes, but NOT a full day of school, without being excused?"

"During the last 30 days, how many times have you skipped or cut a FULL day of school or classes without being excused?"

Discipline

"During the last 30 days, how many times have you been sent to the office for discipline?"


"During the last 30 days, how many times have you had in-school suspension (ISS)?"

"During the last 30 days, how many times have you been suspended from school (out-of-school suspension/OSS)?"

Grades

"How would you describe your grades this school year?"

- None of these letter grades



School Connectedness

"How much do you agree or disagree with each of the following statements?"

- "Overall, adults at my school treat students fairly."
- "Adults at my school listen to the students."
- "The school rules are fair."
- "At my school, teachers care about students."
- "Most teachers at my school are interested in me as a person."



Student Engagement

"How often do you care about doing well in school?"

"How often do you pay attention in class?"



Internalizing

"During the last 12 months, have you had SIGNIFICANT problems...

- "with feeling very trapped, lonely, sad, blue, depressed or hopeless about the future?"
- "with sleep trouble, such as bad dreams, sleeping restlessly or falling asleep during the day?"
- "with feeling very anxious, nervous, tense, scared, panicked or like something bad was going to happen?"
- "with becoming very distressed and upset when something reminded you of the past?"
- "with thinking about ending your life or committing suicide?"

Self Injury

"During the last 12 months, how many times did you do something to purposely hurt or injure yourself without wanting to die, such as cutting, burning, or bruising yourself on purpose?"

- "0 times" "6 to 9 times"

Suicidal Ideation

"Have you ever seriously considered attempting suicide? (Mark ALL that apply)"

Diagnosis of mental, emotional or behavioral problem

"Do you have any long-term mental health, behavioral or emotional problems? Long-term means lasting 6 months or more."

Treatment for Mental Health Problems

"Have you ever been treated for a mental health, emotional or behavioral problem? (Mark ALL that apply)"

Overweight and Obesity

Based on reported height (feet-inches) and weight (pounds)

- Overweight = 25.0 to 29.9
- Obese = 30 or greater

Physical Activity

"During the last 7 days, on how many days were you physically active for a total of AT LEAST 60 MINUTES PER DAY? (Add up all the time you spent in any kind of physical activity that increased your heart rate and made you breathe hard some of the time)"

– "0 days"	– "4 days"

Consumption of Vegetables

"During the last 7 days, how many times did you eat green salad, potatoes, carrots or other vegetables? (Do not count French fries, fried potatoes, or potato chips)."

Consumption of Sugary Drinks

Asthma

"Has a doctor or nurse ever told you that you have asthma?"
